Cork to identify locations suitable for the development of a Strategic Gas Emergency Reserve. The moorings are proposed to be in place for up to 3 years and each mooring will be recovered every 3 to 4 months months for maintenance and redeployment. The redeployment may be in the same location or moved to new locations within the study area depending on data
	needs.
