
Thank you for contacting Irish Lights requesting observations for a Maritime usage licence (LIC230001) under the Maritime Area Planning Act 2021 for site surveys off the coasts of North Dublin, Meath and Louth for a period of 7 years. Irish Lights has no objection to the granting of this licence based on the information supplied.

Irish Lights requests that you include the following terms in the licence-

- Before any aid to navigation (AtoN) can be established, altered or disestablished approval in the form of Statutory Consent under the Merchant Shipping Act must be obtained from the Commissioners of Irish Lights. The AtoN must be coloured and marked as per IALA (International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities) Standards. Any Appropriate Assessment activity conducted as part of this licensing process should include the impact of the deployment of surface marking buoys and associated moorings which are required as part of the project.
- The license sought is located in a relatively busy traffic area. Irish Lights therefore advise consultation with local authorities and the Marine Survey Office (MSO), A Marine Notice should be published for the information of all local maritime users detailing the works, and any vessels which may be engaged in Site Investigation works.
