Re: Letter of Consent for a Marine Usage Licence Application

Dublin Port Company, having its registered office at Port Centre, Alexandra Road, Dublin 1, D01 H4C6, and being the legal owner of certain foreshore and seabed areas within the jurisdiction of Dublin Port, hereby provides its formal consent for the inclusion of part of its maritime property (folio DN44335F) within the Maritime Usage Licence (MUL) application with reference MUL240010 submitted by EirGrid plc, for the purposes of conducting marine survey works in connection with a proposed electricity infrastructure development.

We understand that the relevant proposed activities to be carried out by EirGrid plc may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- · Geophysical and geotechnical marine surveys;
- Environmental and metocean surveys;
- · Deployment of temporary survey equipment;
- Associated access and investigative activities.

Dublin Port Company acknowledges that a portion of the area covered by the MUL application submitted by EirGrid plc overlaps with property legally owned and controlled by Dublin Port Company (folio DN44335F). Accordingly, we confirm that:

- We are the legal owner of the maritime area (folio DN44335F) described in the MUL application, and
- We consent to EirGrid plc's use of that part of the maritime area for the purposes of the said MUL application and the carrying out of the survey activities described above, subject to compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and any port operational requirements as may be agreed separately between the parties.

This letter is issued solely for the purpose of satisfying the requirements of the Maritime Area Planning Act 2021 as amended and associated regulations regarding the need for landowner consent in support of a MUL application.
