

Request for observations on MUL250011 - BioAtlantis Ltd to undertake hand harvesting of Ascophyllum nodosum seaweed from the intertidal shoreline in Kenmare Bay, County Kerry and County Cork.

BIM comments:

BIM promote sustainable management of environmental resources and the use of best practice. The proposed hand harvesting seaweed activity would need to demonstrate that it is compatible with existing active licenced aquaculture and inshore fisheries activities within the application area. Any potential overlap would need to consider in-combination and cumulative effects. Although BIM has no remit in the hand harvesting of seaweed some of our clients and their communities have strong hand harvesting traditions/rights and the proposed activity would need to be consistent with existing activity. Demonstrating compliance with sustainable management and best practice is considered important.

Early and continuous communication should be made with stakeholders in the proposed mapped areas to avoid any conflicts arising with fishermen and aquaculture operators in the areas regarding proposed activities.
