2.1 Reference number of the existing MUL to which material amendment is sought.

2.2 Material amendment(s)

We request an amendment to the existing MUL230024 to remove Specific Condition 37 i) regarding fish spawning and nursery grounds from the Licence to allow the marine usage to be undertaken between 1st February and 30th June.

The AIMU provided with the original application states that *"the risk of insignificant short-term disturbance to known fish spawning areas through which the proposed routes pass is highest from February to June"*. Further information is provided in Attachment 2.2 to substantiate this point and to demonstrate that the risk of disturbance to known fish spawning areas during the period February to June is insignificant and short-term.

The PISCES Marine Survey route within the Irish Maritime Area is approximately 710km in length, the total duration of geophysical surveys along this route is expected to be 26 days and fish spawning and nursery grounds do not cover the entire survey route. As the survey is along a narrow corridor within a vast area, is of low impact, transient and of short-term we do not consider that Specific Condition 37 i) is warranted or justified. Furthermore, this condition has not arisen and is not related to Appropriate Assessment or the Habitats Directive or Annex IV species or Annex habitats.

We provide a report (Attachment 2.2) from our ecologist which assesses the planned marine survey in relation to the specific fish spawning areas along the route and which finds that;

The proposed marine survey if carried out between February and June is outside many of commercial fish spawning areas and or periods. Where the timing of the surveys could potentially interact with spawning species a more detailed review was carried out. In areas where the spawning coincided with the marine survey the maximum area covered by the marine survey was 1% of a fish spawning area for maximum of 8 days duration. The survey is short term and would have minimal impact on fish spawning even if the works were carried out between February and June 2026.

It is noted that observations were received from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) and the Marine Institute (MI) which referenced fish spawning along the survey route. The applicant did not have the opportunity to consider these observations at the time of the MUL determination and acceptance.

The Marine Institute observation states;

- *"Survey route passes through known demersal and pelagic fish spawning and nursery grounds and the range of wild Atlantic Salmon. Most of which cover large spatial expanses, making the survey area relatively small and with limited survey restricted, likely to have little impact."* &
- *"It is not expected that any long-lasting effects on fish or habitats of significance would result from the proposed survey."*

The DAFM observation references the MI observations and states; *"DAFM would like to stress the importance, for this reason that any geographical surveys are undertaken outside of the main spawning and fishing periods."*



In summary the applicant requests the removal of Specific Condition 37 i) from MUL230024;

- i. The risk of disturbance to known fish spawning areas is insignificant and short-term;
- ii. The condition is not related to Appropriate Assessment or the Habitats Directive or Annex IV species or Annex habitats;
- iii. The DAFM observation "*that any geographical surveys are undertaken outside of the main spawning and fishing periods,*" appears to be based on observations of the Marine Institute (MI). However, the MI observations do not appear to recommend, request or justify such a requirement.

The applicant considers that Specific Condition 37 i) of MUL230024 is a very onerous condition that overly restricts the proposed Maritime Usage and that is not justified by the assessments undertaken or observations received.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to allow marine environmental survey for the PISCES telecoms cable to proceed in Irish waters between February and June 2026.

The PISCES project is multi-jurisdictional (a planned telecoms cable between Ireland-France-Spain-Portugal) and marine survey commenced in September 2025 and have been completed in the Spain jurisdiction and are nearing completion in the France jurisdiction.

DSFN were granted the MUL for marine survey in May 2025. The Marine Survey vessel mobilised from the Canary Islands at the end of August 2025 and it was planned to transit to Galway and to begin survey in Irish waters. However, there was no safe weather window available to transit to Irish waters and the vessel instead transited to Bilbao and commenced works during September 2025 with the expectation to complete works in Irish waters during the winter months. However, weather conditions have been significantly worse than predicted and the vessel has completed works between Spain and France only and there is no weather window currently foreseen to complete a safe transit to Irish waters once operations are completed in France.

There have been long delays in survey operations (longer than foreseen despite programming for a winter campaign) and the vessel has not been able to complete works or safely transit to Irish waters before the end of January 2026.

There is no change related to the planned maritime usage or regarding the classes of usage in Schedule 7.
